- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within [8] weeks.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]
- 4. Termination of the agreement

[It is up to the involved institutions to agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the interinstitutional agreement. However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."]

1. Grading systems of the institutions

Modern Business School grading scale related to ECTS grading system:

The grading system at Modern Business School fully corresponds to the ECTS grading system. Student's achievement is continuously assessed and expressed in points. Students can achieve a maximum of 100 points for one subject. Student's success is expressed by grades from 5 (failed) to 10 (excellent – outstanding) (see Table 1).
