

ENROLMENT INTO MASTER AND DOCTORAL DEGREE PROGRAMMES IN THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2024/2025

Candidates of non EU states

APPLICATION SUBMISSION

The application for enrolment should be submitted electronically through the [web portal eVŠ](#).

Supplemental documents (listed below) must also be submitted electronically through eVŠ (scanned).

APPLICATION DATES

First application period: April 1 to 30, 2024

An application is considered to be submitted in time if it has been completed online through the eVŠ web portal (with all supplemental documents) within the application deadline **(no later than April 30, 2024)**.

Second application period: May 1 to 31, 2024

An application is considered to be submitted in time if it has been completed online through the eVŠ web portal (with all supplemental documents) within the application deadline **(no later than May 31, 2024)**.

Third application period: June 1 to 30, 2024

An application is considered to be submitted in time if it has been completed online through the eVŠ web portal (with all supplemental documents) within the application deadline **(no later than June 30, 2024)**.

Fourth application period: July 1 to 31, 2024

An application is considered to be submitted in time if it has been completed online through the eVŠ web portal (with all supplemental documents) within the application deadline **(no later than July 31, 2024)**.

Fifth application period: August 1 to 31, 2024

An application is considered to be submitted in time if it has been completed online through the eVŠ web portal (with all supplemental documents) within the application deadline **(no later than August 31, 2024)**.

Sixth application period: September 1 to 23, 2024

An application is considered to be submitted in time if it has been completed online through the eVŠ web portal (with all supplemental documents) within the application deadline **(no later than September 23, 2024)**.

Supplemental documents:

1. **the final certificate of completed education.** The document must be legalized on the basis of:
 - the Hague Conventions of 1961 (in the court of territorial jurisdiction where the certificate was obtained), the APOSTILLE mark must be duly completed, or
 - The Act on the Certification of Documents in International Traffic.

* Legalization of the original certificate of education is not required in cases where it is completely abolished by the bilateral agreement (Austria, Bulgaria, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Czech Republic, France, Greece, Croatia, Hungary, Republic of Northern Macedonia, Serbia).
2. **certified** (by court) **Slovene translation** of the original final certificate referred to in No 1,
3. **transcript of records** (with average grade) or a diploma supplement,
4. **certified** (by court) **Slovene translation** of the certificate referred to in No 3.

5. **certificate of knowledge of the Slovenian or English language at B2 level – depending on the selected Slovenian or English implementation of masters study program.**

Does not apply to candidates from Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, Kosovo, Macedonia and Serbia).
